

The Candidates kneel, as the rest of the assembly stands and prays for them in silence. The people may extend their hands in blessing over the candidates. The Dean then prays in the name of the assembly, and all respond, "Amen."

The new members of the Community at the Crossing are vested in the albs they will wear whenever they gather for common prayer in the Cathedral and in their oratory.

Receive now the cross that will mark you as a member of the Community and the Rule of Life that will guide you as you seek the Lord who has begun this good work in you.

The members of the Community come forward to receive the cross and the Rule.





THE COMMUNION

The Holy Communion is distributed under the forms of both Bread and Wine. In the interest of public health, the Cathedral does not practice intinction, that is, the dipping of the Bread into the Wine. It is the faith of the Church that Jesus gives himself in the Sacrament whether it is received in only one kind or both. Gluten-free Wafers are available; please make your need known to the minister.
